Reading at St Keyna

At St Keyna we use Read Write Inc Phonics (RWI) to give your child the best possible start with their English. We have put together a guide to explain how the RWI programme works together with some useful links.

Our English team consists of Mrs Elizabeth Montagu our English Lead, Mrs Claire Harris our Phonics Lead and Mrs Kathryn Chivers our RWI Co-ordinator. If you have questions about phonics, please contact school who can refer you to our team. Please take the time to read the following information as it will provide invaluable information as to how you can help and support your child in reading.

How will RWI be taught?

All children are assessed regularly by Mrs Chivers, so they work in groups of children at the same level. This allows complete participation in lessons.

Nursery

In the last term of Nursery, children are taught to say the sounds of letters with the help of mnemonics to blend sounds into words and read simple 'blending books'

Reception

In Reception all children will learn how to 'read' the sounds in words and how those sounds can be written down.

Your child will learn to:

- 1. Read letters by their 'sounds'
- 2. Blend these sounds into words
- 3. Read the words in a story.

Set 1 Speed Sounds

These are sounds written with one letter and taught in the following order, together with rhymes, to help children form the letters correctly and instantly recognise them ready for blending:

masdtinpgockubfelhrjvywzx

and sounds written with two letters (your child will call these 'special friends'): sh th ch qu ng nk ck kn wh ph

• Check if your child can read these sounds. Make sure they say pure sounds like 'mmm', not letters names like 'em'. Watch the Sounds Pronunciation Guide video to help you.

Handwriting phrases for helping your child to form letters

This works best if your child practises for a short time every day.

- I. Show the picture side and air-write as you say the phrase.
- 2. Ask your child to practise in the air with you.
- 3. Using a sharp pencil and sat at a table, encourage your child to have a go.
- 4. Praise your child for their efforts.
- m Maisie, mountain, mountain
- a round the apple, down the leaf
- 5 slither down the snake
- d round his bottom, up his tall neck and down to his feet
- t down the tower, across the tower
- i down the body, dot for the head
- n down Nobby, over his net
- p down the plait and over the pirate's face
- g round her face, down her hair and give her a curl
- 0 all around the orange
- C curl around the caterpillar
- k down the kangaroo's body, tail and leg
- U down and under, up to the top and draw the puddle
- b down the laces to the heel, round the toe
- f down the stem and draw the leaves
- e lift off the top and scoop out the egg
- down the long leg
- h down the head to the hooves and over his back
- r down his back and then curl over his arm
- down his body, curl and dot
- V down a wing, up a wing
- U down a horn, up a horn and under his head
- W down, up, down, up
- Z zig-zag-zig
- q round her head, up past her earrings and down her hair
- X down the arm and leg and repeat the other side







 You can help your child to practise the Speed Sounds they have learnt with the Speed Sounds cards and the writing practise sheets that will be sent home.

Using the flashcards

- 1. Ask your child to say the name of the picture, e.g. a-a-a-apple, sssssnake, getting quicker each time.
- 2. Help your child to say the sound hidden behind each picture, e.g. 's' is behind the snake. Repeat until your child can do this quickly.
- 3. Help your child to say the letter, getting quicker each time. If he or she needs a reminder, look at the picture side to help. When your child can say the sounds without checking the picture, increase the speed!



Using the A4 Sound Sheet

You'll see that each sound is drawn in the shape of a picture.

For example:

- 's' is in the shape of a snake
- 'd' is in the shape of a dinosaur
- 'a' is in the shape of an apple
- 'm' is in the shape of two mountains

Once your child can read Set 1 Speed Sounds confidently, he or she can learn to read words. First, your child is introduced to a toy frog called Fred. Fred can only say the sounds in a word and needs your child to help him read the word. So, when you hear your child say 'Fred Talk', you'll know this means sounding out the word. You can help your child to read words by following these steps:

1. Make up a word with three cards that your child can read quickly, e.g. c-a-t.







Point to and say the sounds, and then say the word. Ask your child to copy you. Muddle up the cards. Ask your child to make the word again, and then point to and say the sounds. Repeat with more 3-sound words, including some containing sounds made up of more than one letter, e.g. m-a-t mat, c-a-t cat, g-o-t got, f-i-sh fish, ch-a-t, sh-i-p, th-i-s.

- 2. Put out three cards. This time, ask your child to say the sounds. Help him or her to blend the sounds into the words, until your child can do it without help.
- 3. Repeat with some 4-sound words, e.g. b-l-i-p, f-r-o-g, g-r-i-n, s-t-o-p, j-u-m-p, h-a-n-d, b-l-a-ck.

Your child will bring home a Sound Blending Book to read to you, which will be changed twice a week. Ask your child to read each word in sounds (Fred Talk) and then say the word. Then, he or she can turn over and check if they're right. Your child will also choose a Free Choice Reading Book to help encourage the love of reading. This book can be changed regularly.



Nonsense words (Alien words)



As well as learning to read and blend real words children will have plenty of opportunities to apply their sound recognition skills on reading 'Nonsense words'. These words will also feature heavily in the Year One Phonics Screening check usually in the summer term, although more recently due to Covid, it has been in the autumn term.

Set 2 and 3 Speed Sounds Reading Book


A Speed Sound Reading Book will be given to your child to be kept in their bookbag. Ask your child to read the sound at the top of each page as quickly as he or she can. If your child hesitates reading a sound, use the picture on the left hand side as a reminder.

- Within all the books children will have Red and Green words to learn to help them to become speedy readers. Red words are words that are not easily decodable and challenge words to extend children's vocabulary. Green words are linked to the sounds they have been learning and are easily decodable.
- Your child will bring home decodable (Book Bag Books) Storybooks and Non-Fiction books to read to you which will be changed twice a week. Please ask your child to read the Green Words and Red Words on the inside of the cover before listening to them read the book. Your child will also choose a Free Choice Reading Book to help encourage the love of reading. This book can be changed regularly.

My Set 2 and 3 Speed Sound Reading Book

Ask your child to say the sound at the top of each page. Use the picture to remind them if needed. Soon your child will be able to read the sound without the picture prompt.

RWI Online

Your child will be given access to RWI online via oxfordowl.co.uk and will able to log on with their username and password to read their class Storybook at home. This is the book he or she will have read at school three times with their reading teacher, so they should be able to read the story or non-fiction book confidently. There is a quiz at the end to see how they have understood the story.

Reading Challenge

Everyday you read a decodable book (Book bag Book) with your child and record it in their Reading Record, it will count towards the 15 reads on our Rainbow Reading Challenge. All classes participate in this challenge and once your child reaches 15 reads, they get a certificate and receive a prize. Once they reach 120 reads, they receive a certificate and choose a brand new book from our Treasure Chest.





We have a Storytime every day at school to help encourage children to develop a love of books. Regularly reading a bedtime story to your child can also help open the doors to so many different worlds and give your child the tools to become independent life-long learners.
